Sharp passed away September 3, 2001 at the age of 80 after a long and courageous battle against a number of serious illnesses. Sharp was a DX-er's DX-er, and a contester's contester. Although he was not one of our first members, he assumed the role of elder statesman by the way in which he lived his life and the qualities we all hope to achieve. His leadership by example will continue to be an inspiration to us all. He exemplified and embodied the very meaning of everything it is to be a ham radio operator. He never had a critical word for anyone, though we often deserved it. He only offered praise, support, enthusiasm, teamwork, leadership and patience. The American Radio Relay League had Hiram Percy Maxim as its "Old Man." The Texas DX Society had something even better, Clarence Sharp. He was more than an "Elmer" to all of us. He was the quiet strength and confidence that every club needs to be successful. We shall miss the touch of his gentle but guiding hand over the pursuit of DX and contesting activities that we all love so dearly. Since we all missed the funeral, Sharp's wife Irma, and son Mike plan to attend our next meeting to read the eulogy given at the funeral, and to give us the chance to express our condolences to the family.
