The meeting will be at the same place as last month, Chapelwood United Methodist Church, 11140 Greenbay, in Room 5 of the Copeland Center. Time is 7:00 to 9:00 PM. Dinner will be at Goode Co. on Katy Freeway at 6:00 PM.

This month's program takes a little turn away from Ham Radio. Mike Wheat will join us and discuss an industry that is known to most of us, cellular telephones.

Mike, AB5IX, got his early education in electronics at a ripe old age of 17. He worked as an assistant engineer at KQTI AM in Edna, Texas. DX Report by Ken – AB5A

Hello TDXS'ers. There have been some great Dxpeditions in place this last month but propagation has really kept the activity down. The upper bands are not opening and the lower bands are useful for shorter periods because of the long summer days.

5K0Z, San Andreas & Providencia Not a rare entity but there were some unique aspects of this operation. First they had a special callsign, which is nice for prefix hunters. They were active on the low bands especially 160M and they were active on Satellites via AO-40. IOTA NA-033. QSL via: DH7WW.

3G1A, Santa Maria Is. IOTA SA-069 The Southern Cross DX Group is using the special Chilean prefix 3G for this IOTA activation. QSL via CE4USW or Buro

6W1RD, Senegal Again not a rare one but “Billy” or Bilal Youssef has hooked up a computer sound card for RTTY. QSL via CBA

TG9KZ, Guatemala Again not a rare one but seldom hear on RTTY. Francisco has also hooked up a computer sound card and has been active on both RTTY & PSK31. QSL via CBA. In researching this QSL path I found conflicting information which makes this operation suspect.

YW1T, Toas Is. IOTA SA-066 was activated in celebration of Venezuelan Navy day. QSL via W4SO mail drop or via Buro.

VE9W, White Head Is. IOTA NA-014, CISA NB-010 was activated by a team of operators during the IOTA contest. QSL via VE2CWI

5C2MI, Mogador Is. IOTA AF-065 was activated 26-28 July. QSL via I2JSB

LU1ZA, South Orkney. Laurie Island ,IOTA AN-008, has a new operator, “Claudio” He is heard mostly on weekends in particular Saturday mornings. LU4DXU is the pilot station and runs a list operation. QSL via LU4DXU

8Q7ZZ, Maldive Is. IOTA AS-013 has a team of operators on all bands and modes until 11Aug 2002. Propagation for us in Texas has been very difficult. 17M seems to be the best opportunity to work this DX.

They have been active on 30M and worked NA east coast but the path to TX has a very short window. QSL via G3SWH

6M Sporadic E (Es) The late July early August period has been active on 6M. Several double hop Es openings to the NW have yielded new grids for operators in EL29. There have also been fairly unique short Es openings to KS, NM, West TX & MO. Ah, the magic band, don't ya just love it. HF will let ya down in the summer and when it does 6M does its magic.

A Hundred others, DX These are the one that I failed to mention for lack of omniscience. You can help me with these. I most likely to mention stuff I'm chasing so keep me posted of what your chasing and I'll be certain to share it. DX is out there!!! Go get it, wrangle it and tell me about it.
