A CONTEST TRAINING GROUND

Many members have told me they do not get into contests to help the TDXS efforts simply because they do not know how or they do not have any experience and do not know where to get it. I attempted to address some of their problems at the May meeting. At the meeting, we discussed the 122 contests that occur each year that aren't in the "Big Time" category. The intent was to show everyone where the "training grounds" are that almost all current prominent contesters used to sharpen their skills and make their mistakes.

I hope everyone wanting the experience has taken advantage of the information by now. Also, I am sure all who participated in our FD effort are better operators today because of the few hours they put in. FD is always is great because our new contests can sit and watch the old timers fill the logs almost as easy as they can swill beer. Then, while the lesson is fresh in their mind, they can sit down in front of a rig and practice what they have learned. FD is an excellent training ground...but don't lose what you have gained! Use what you have learned soon and, believe me, you will glow with satisfaction as you see yourself improve as each log sheet goes on the pile.

Now, I am sure it is no secret that the TDXS will again make a big play at the ARRL Sweepstakes contests in November. Gad - thats five months away and nothing but DX contests to keep in shape on. DX contests are okay but they are not the best type of contest to prep yourself for a big effort in the SS to help us win the Gavel this year in the Medium Class club category.

But, weep not my friends, because their is a good training ground coming soon.... real soon! The 1980 IARU Radiosport takes place July 12-13 this year and with the continuing hot sun spot activity, it promises to be a real dandy. This contest is unique in that you folks can practice both DX and domestic style contesting. Both types of contacts are ok in this test. You can practice your skills at knocking out strings of US contacts (like Sweepstakes) and also work DX to build your skills at cracking pile-ups. This contest also offers an opportunity to work on your DXCC and the TDXS WAZ competition because the DX will be all over the place 10 through 160. This is a "everybody work everybody" game with all sorts of awards for almost all who give it a try. Radiosport rules appear in the May issue of QST.

I encourage you to work the DX but you must discipline yourself to take plenty of time to practice your skills at running contact after contact with those strong US signals answering your CQ RS. TDXS members (4) made 6,626 QSO's last year so I do not think you will have any trouble getting answers. I made over 1600 QSO's on CW using a Tribander so a big station is definitely not required to have a ball. If your CW is weak, I pray you will use this contest to bring up speed before November.

We need your help in November and the Radiosport is a super training ground to get you and your station ready for the challenge. I am certain the experienced contesters will be glad to answer your questions regarding Radiosport and will offer hints to get you going. I promise I will because I want to see your scores published in QST for both of these contests
