Contest Report

Well, October has turned out to be a busy month for contesting — lots of results out, lots of rumors surfacing, and, of course, lots of preparation being made for sweepstakes.

In the area of firm results, the October OQ carries the finals for last year's OQ WW CW contest. Conditions were great for this one, especially the farther northeast you were. Single OP tops for the Fifth District were K5ZD at N5AU (#4/USA). K5GA (#13/USA), and N5JJ (#23/USA). Other club member single OPs listed among the living were W5ASP and N5CDO slugging it out on 10 and K5BZU on 80. In case you're wondering where everyone else was that weekend, they were probably a member of one of the two club multi-op teams — W5RRR (by K5GN, K5U, KN5H and W5WHR) or K5KG (with KD4M, K5TU, K5VWW, N5DU and W5SG). Although K5GA still holds the USA multi-op/single XTMR record for OQ SSB, the extremely good East Coast conditions allowed the CW record to be taken from K5RC. I'm sure plans are being made to recapture that title. It was quite unique for the same station to hold the record for both modes at once.

Also out in this month's QST are complete results for the 1981 ARRL DX contest. The SSB weekend provided some great conditions with K5GN operating K5RC to the number 3 spot for 10 in the USA. The top single OP all-bander in South Texas was KN5H. Steve just missed winning the Texas plaque by 8.14 QSOs. It might be pointed out that the single band categories for South Texas were well covered by TDXS members. Besides 10 meters by Dave K5GN, 15 was won by W5WHR at K5WA, 20 by K5GA, 40 by N5JJ (which turned out to be the high 40 meter score for the USA), and 80 by K5BZU. K5KG with a little help from K5LZO, K5TU, KA5GJO, N5DU and W5ASP was the Fifth District high multi-op/single XTMR. Other members listed in the phone results were K5DK and N5CDO.

The CW weekend for the ARRL DX provided some nice low band conditions but overall were fairly marginal. Generally, marginal condx requires more pronounced operating skill. It will take a skilled OP who knows where to look for the short openings and how to take advantage of them. K5GN's score reflects this skill in his 4th place/USA finish in a top ten consisting mostly of East Coast. Fine job, Dave! In spite of this, however, Dave is still stuck with the K25M Texas plaque. And speaking of Dennis,

It's rare to see someone go to so much effort as to go all the way to Caracas just to run W's for a weekend. In case you can't remember what either of these four-eyes looks like, just feast your bifocals on pages 81 and 85 of the October QST. Again, we had a nice showing for TDXS members with KN5H at K5IY #1 for 20, K5WA for 15, and WBSWHR on 10. Also listed on code were W5ASP, K5DK, K5BZU and an obscure Saudi station manned by K5KG. George did a terrific job from so far away plus having to work during the contest. High multi/single for W5 was N5CDO with moral support from N5JJ followed closely by AA5Y with K5TU, K5SU, N5DU and W5JQ. Although the club aggregate score is down due to the number of single band efforts this year, I feel the group is to be congratulated for its fine overall listing.

The rumors are out for the radiosport championship. Shown as being among the tops in the US are:

Not a bad showing at all! The Fifth District does seem to do well in this contest. By taking the top 6 stations out of each of the 4 categories, 10 of these 24 are in W5 land. This may be due to the fact that generally summer conditions give the most southern stations the edge, especially on 10 and 15. However much some may grumble as to the need to reorganize the scoring structure for radiosport, it still gives any any contingent a chance at winning. Thanks to AA2Z for sending down a copy of the high claims.

I am sure we are all proud to be able to exhibit our club gavel for the SS win in 1980. The biggest credit the gavel can offer is to the individual cohesiveness and unselfishness within the group that it takes to produce a winning club entry. A lot of time preparing and operating for sweepstakes was spent by many who may not really care for SS, but wanted to see the club do well.

This year seems to be shaping up nicely with many new towers and antennas going up for November. K25M is ready to initiate litigation against the Houston emporium unless we get his beams in soon. Others without stations are making arrangements for homes for the contests. Last year the club seemed to lack the drive to win the medium class club gavel. We went through the motion of drafting and trying to get pumped up, but could only muster a total of 43 entries. The club that finished #1 in the medium category has a roster in excess of 200 - so, 50 entries was a snap for them. However, I feel we really weren't beaten, we just lost because of the bad luck of 2

member's scores being disqualified and our overall lack of intensity resulting in some scores not being submitted. How close we were to being first should show the importance of everyone operating and submitting their score, even if they feel it is insignificant. We'll have more to say about SS at the next club meeting, so please don't miss it.
