ARRL BULLETINS VIA RTTY COURTESY W5DOZ HR ARRL Bulletin NR 141 from ARRL Headquarters, Newington, CT December 29, 1983 To All Radio Amateurs BT

FCC has commenced issuing ten year amateur licenses. Although PR docket 83 337 was adopted in October 1983, actual implementation was delayed until necessary changes could be made in the fcc computer licensing programs. The Commission emphasizes that the ten year license term is not a blanket extension of existing station and operator licenses. An Amateur license that specifies less than a ten year term will show a ten year term on the face of the license when it is either modified or renewed. HR ARRL Bulletin NR 133 from ARRL Headquarters Newington CT December 14, 1983

Effective January 14, 1983, the WIAW Saturday and Sunday code practice at 2100 UTC, 4 PM EST, and CW bulletin at 2200 UTC, 5 PM EST, transmissions will be discontinued. The remainder of the WIAW schedule remains unchanged. The complete schedule will appear in February 1984 QST AR

CONTEST REPORT (by K2TNO) Hope you're all set for the final month or two of the winter contest season. The big news is our TDXS efforts at XE2FU, covered elsewhere in the B'Sheet. But for you stay-at-homes, this is your year to top the section! Look at it this way - the hottest competition always comes from here in the club with all those multi-megawatt + 17 elements on 40 type stations. Many of those stations are going to be silent for this one - the perfect opportunity for you to shine with that lil' tribander and some operating skill. So why not set aside some time for the ARRL DX Contest? You might try a single-band effort; 80 meters for example has been red-hot of late.

Remember, the contest starts on Friday night (0000 Z), February 17 for CW and the same time March 2 for SSB. There will be sample logs and dupe sheets at the February meeting.

As a little incentive, your friendly New Yawk contest chairperson hereby issues the Official TDXS-XE2FU QSO challenge and Grudge Match. Whichever TDXS full member station contacts XE2FU the most times wins a case of cold beer stones from ol' Tuna Nose himself. There are only twelve possible QSO's necessary for this coveted award, 160-10 M CW + 160-10 M SSB. So get out there and warm up that 160 sloper and see if you can crack the piles. In case of a tie at twelve, each winner gets a cool 24. A tie below 12 will split the case. The award will be made at the April meeting - be there or be square!

Meanwhile, back at the bands, our ex-TDXSer K5ZD and the National Contest Journal have their semi-annual North American Sprints in February. The CW team of ten is set as follows: KG5U, NM5M, NM5L, K5RC(K5GN), K5LZO, KN5H, N5JJ, KZ5M, NA5R, K5TU. The CW Sprint starts Saturday, February 4 at 0100Z. It's only 4 hours long, so why not give it a try this year? Next to Sweepstakes, this has gotta be the best W/VE event of the year. No need to be on a team - just get on and swap QSO nr, name, and state with everybody on 80-40-20 M. Fast, efficient band changing is a must for this one, so get out the white tape and pre-tune everything. Remember: you must give up the frequency after you CQ and get a reply. But, you little pistols take heart -

that means you get the QRG after you answer a CQ. That's a great equalizer. Have fun.

We're still not QRV for the Phone Sprint - somehow all you mike-mouths out there have stayed away from the team! I will need to send in a list of the team members on Wednesday, February 8. Wo when you get this, check into the repeater on 96/36 for the Tuesday 9 PM DX Net or call me at home in the evenings at 665-6298 to register. The contest is Saturday, Feb. 11. Already on the Sprint SSB team are: KG5U, NM5L, K5LZO, N5JJ, KZ5M, and maybe KN5H.


