Treasurers Report, de Mike, KC5CP

The status of the club at the end of 1994 was better than I expected. We did not have a fund raiser this past year like we normally do at the Convention but we were able to sell several assets of the club. I will go through a list of income and expense groups to show you what we did last year. (All amounts are in dollars.) INCOME: Dues 1237, Interest 68, Repeater 389, Donations 1528 and Banquet 960. Total income \$4182. EXPENSES: Banquet 1170, Bullsheet 880, Field Day 185, Hamfests 911, Insurance 255, Post Office 101, QSL's 102 and Misc. 226. Total expenses \$3830. Net gain during 1994 of \$352.00. You might say this was a good year and now for the details. Details: We had 38 members and guests show up for our yearly TDXS banquet and everyone had a good time. After all the expenses were paid we lost over two hundred dollars on this event. (Maybe it was a good thing for the club not to have one this year.) The Swapfest/Auction at the Farm &

Ranch Club was a nice event but we only broke even on expenses. The reoccurring monthly expenses like the Bullsheet, Field Day, QSL cards and others cost a lot. Many of these expenses form the backbone of our club communications and we would not be the TDXS without things like the Bullsheet or first place at Field Day. We have been doing them for years and everyone gets the benefits, especially those that participate.

How we made money: The sale of the old repeater brought in cash and the new repeater maintenance costs have been minor, thus we are ahead in this category. We sold a tower that several of you helped take down, plus items that were taken to the Lumberyard and a small crankup tower. All of these items really helped increase the donations and many thanks to those of you who helped with this part of our club activities. These club members really helped keep us in the black when it came to our check book and budget! What's ahead for 95? I expect we will have about 42 members this year in TDXS, thus our income should be about the same as last year. We will not have the income from the sale of assets like we did last year, but we may get lucky with a Houston convention. If there is no convention, the Farm & Ranch Club may be our only chance at another auction/swapfest but it will require getting more people involved to be able to make money for TDXS. June will be a very active month, the Arlington Hamvention will start the month, I will be attending a national convention in Alabama and we try to get another first place finish with Field Day at the W5SJS Ranch. I expect our meetings to continue at the Tracy G. Community Center until someone finds us a more centrally located place. Any ideas? Dues: Only about half of you have paid your dues as of the first of February. I will be imposing the ten dollar late fee on those that are now past due, so please do not blame me for having to ask you for \$35. Lets have a good 1995, win a few contests and work some new DX.

Rover – de Ron, K5LLL

Rover

No, its not a dog. It's operating VHF/UHF mobile/portable in several grids, similar to an Armadillo run.

For those not familiar with VHF and UHF activity, "grids" are geographical rectangles one degree in latitude by two degrees in longitude. Instead of scoring based on states, counties, countries or zones, VHFers work grids. For more information see your handbook.

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Houston happens to be in grid EL29; north of IAH is grid EM20. These are fairly well populated with contacts on most VHF and UHF bands a sure thing. During the January VHF contest, I decided to head south for EL18 and EL28 which are relatively rare in terms of VHF activity.

My first trip was Saturday afternoon, the 21st, a beautiful day. I loaded my 2 meter multimode, 6 meter SSB and 902 MHz rigs into the truck along with a 2M bigwheel (tnx K5WA), 6M Halo (tnx W5SJS) and 13 element 902 yagi. On the way, I made contacts from EL29 and EL19 on 6 and 2 meters. I arrived at Bay City, found a suitable location and worked a few stations. I then moved to EL18 a few miles west with the same results. Somewhat disappointed that most stations must have shut down for the afternoon, I headed for home. KB5IUA was happy to work me in four grids on three bands, however.

The junior op, KK5DK, showed up Saturday evening to operate from the home station so I decided to repeat the trip on Sunday, this time taking a small 2M beam to help with the distant Houston Stations. Sunday, however, was not a beautiful day, the first clue was the rain I ran through before getting to Bay City. A quick set up in EL28 netted a few more contacts than Saturday but efforts on 902 with the home station were unsuccessful. In fact later we could not even make reliable contact on 2M SSB due to the stormy weather, static and lightning. A quick move to EL18 netted one contact with the home station on 2M. With the weather looking very threatening, I headed for home. The road between Bay City and Wharton at one point was almost inundated (thought I might have to use /MM) but when I got to Wharton the sun was shining. I later heard that a tornado had been sighted in the area. From there to Houston the weather got worse. I pulled in the driveway and unloaded just before the rain and hail hit.

Final score from the home station was 5624 points (113 Q's and 37 grids), I didn't even calculate my rover score. No running JA's on 15 for me when I can work contests like this!

The CW QSO Party was a real "race to the wire" among the top four. N4ZZ up in Tennessee took top honors with 139K. Right on his heels were Dave, K6LL, Steve, KN5H (at K7UP), and Bill, K5GA (at W5WMU). Looks like the Arizona guys (K6LL and KN5H) took good advantage of their longer 20 M opening. The TDXS "A-Team" turned in a 437K team score in spite of one no-show.

In the Phone QSO Party the team of K5DX, KI3L, KB5YVT, N5RP and W5ASP put together 522K points... not all that shabby! This is truly one of the more pleasant contest events. Enough activity to make it interesting but still at a relaxed level with time to pass a moment with old friends. In spite of the commercial QRM on 40 and the occasional obnoxious inhabitant of 75, it's a fun Saturday for even the non-serious operator. The next one comes up in mid-August. You might want to give it a try.

A glance at the contest schedule below shows a full slate of events coming up in February. While the European contests won't inundate the bands, given the current propagation conditions, there could be some interesting band-country opportunities, especially in the French affair.

The "biggie" is obviously the ARRL DX CW contest. There will be a serious effort from K5XI with several "hired-guns" (W6OAT, KN5H, NM5M) along with a bunch of the more avid locals. Tom, K5RC is even now putting up more wire and fine tuning all the bits and pieces. Looks like it's gonna be a wild and crazy weekend.

In spite of the extensive array of aluminum and steel available at Sid's place, we will still need additional "ears" on all bands for the entire weekend. Any time you can spend sorting through the bands for choice DX spots will be deeply appreciated. If you don't have packet, put them out over the voice repeater. (Contrary to the comments of some, that is still the primary purpose of the TDXS repeater.) With luck we'll pick them up.. or, better yet, one of the guys on packet will enter them.

While not everyone in the TDXS has the same intense interest in contesting as those of us who do it regularly, it is one area where our "medium" size club can run with the

"big dogs", and reaffirm our enviable record of accomplishments. TDXS "team" and "multi" events give every member a chance to help out with just a modest effort on their part. Just ask yourself why it was that you were so damned anxious to get into TDXS. It was simply because TDXS had a unique reputation based upon success, either in DXing, Contesting, or Field Day. Doesn't this suggest that we all have an obligation to support each other in the pursuit of our chosen interests.

With so many Honor Roll members in the group now there isn't the evident passion for DX that once drove many of us. Yet, I sincerely hope that the repeater/packet will come thundering back to life the next time Bhutan, Yemen, or Andaman show up. In the meanwhile "support your local contester". He'll carry the TDXS banner while you kick back and enjoy feeding him Qs.

For those who chose to contest, a couple of requests. First, PLEASE get your scores to me quickly after the contests. Now days, contest scores are collected and listed on the INTERNET "Contest Reflector" within several days of the event. No longer is it necessary to wait months to see the "claimed scores" and find out how you/we did. Send them to me via packet (I check K5WA PacketCluster BBS daily), via INTERNET (jastaples@aol.com or 71045.2632@compuserve.com), via KK5DK's telephone BBS, or simply call me. I have two lines, both with recorders.

Second, if you do operate in ANY contest event, send in your log (ALWAYS clearly marked Texas DX Society). It doesn't matter how little time you spend or how few contacts you log, just SEND IT IN! I you are in doubt about the date, time, rules, scoring, mailing address for any contest... let me know and I'll do what I can to help. I can even provide you with suitable contest software (there's a lot of good stuff in the public domain).

And finally, for those non-contesters in the TDXS. If you've read this far, maybe there is hope for you yet. Far be it for me to try to divert a "True DXer" from the "One Path" but then some of you guys are actually pretty good Ops and there's always room for more in the 'tests. Anyway. one way or the other we'll have fun.. and after all that's all the really counts.. Isn't it?
