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BS7H A TOTAL FARCE

Another "major" expedition goes out with a whimper. As I sit hear at 0900Z Saturday, I find the BS7H guys went home early, without even giving the W5s a shot except on 20 meters. Amazingly BS7H went QRT only after Japan had a full weekend day to work them without competition, but before the US hams who have to work for a living found they won't have a chance for BS7 until the next millennia. All the pre-expedition publicity with 18 frequencies apparently only applied to JAs and Europeans. They missed every good 40 meter opening to our area, and apparently had trouble keeping two rigs on the air. Their RTTY equipment failed as did attempts to get on 160 and 80. It seems to me that QSO count, translated into maximum \$ contributions is all that matters anymore. Trying to watch propagation and work all areas is only given lip service. Congratulations to the many of you who did work them.

As you might infer, I am tired of planning my schedule to listen for and work expeditions that make no attempt to operate according to their advance publicity. Maybe things will improve in May!

The next big one is 3C0DX - The DXpedition to Annobon Island (IOTA AF-039) is confirmed from 20 to 27 May. ### US Islands Award

This award has grown dramatically on the past two years. NL7TB organized the effort, and so far close to 1000 US islands have been activated, including 20+ here in Texas. It is a cross between DX and County hunting, although no one has them all! A comprehensive homepage which includes rules, pictures, the island list, etc. is available at <http://www.owt.com/usislands/> One group in Alaska that will be putting out many IOTA and US islands this summer has a great homepage at <http://www.customcpu.com/personal/kl7fh/> Do not confuse the USIA with IOTA. IOTA only counts specific saltwater island groups, while the USIA has river, lake, and saltwater islands, the later which sometimes also count for IOTA. The island corridor is 14250-260, with many US islands running on 14260 when no IOTA islands are
