Contest Corner – de Joe, W5ASP

The latest NCJ has the results for the August NAQPs and the September Sprints. In the NAQP CW our TDXS Team #1 was 4th and Team #2 was 15th. Dave, K5GN was 5th overall (right behind Eric, NM5M). In the Phone NAQP Team #1 was 10th (only 3 scores). In CW Sprint TDXS was eight (only 5 logs from the 10 man team). Again Dave, K5GN led TDXS with a 3rd place overall (followed by Randy, K5ZD and Trey, N5KO). Phone Sprint was a bit better with TDXS taking 3rd though again there were only five scores reported. For the limited number of club members who participated we did reasonably well. Wonder how we might have done with a full effort?

At the February meeting I suggested that TDXS begin a program which would recognize the efforts of those TDXSers who actively contribute to Team/Club scores

each year. Awards would be presented by the Club to such individuals at the Annual Banquet.

The intent would NOT be to single out individuals for their personal achievements in contesting, but to focus on all who contribute significantly to the group's effort. It would not be a competition amongst TDXSers, but a open-ended program to encourage as many members who care to do so to join in whenever possible.

The program would be open to all TDXSers regardless of their "dues status". This is in keeping with the concept that "Once a TDXSer, always a TDXSer". Recognition would go not only to active testers, i.e. those actually engaged in contests and submitting logs, but also to those who make a consistent effort to contact their fellow members during contests.

The details of such a program remain to be worked out. However, I see no great difficulty in making the idea work. Essentially all contest activity today is computerized. Determining those who are active contributors to the TDXS contest efforts should pose no great problem.

If (and only IF) there is an evident interest in such a program among a significant number of members, I will submit a more definite scheme for consideration at a later meeting.

DX – de Buzz, N5UR

Well both March DXpeditions are active as I write this, ZL7DK until March 8 and N2OO/KH9 on SSB and N6MZ/KH9 on cw until March 11. The KH9 boys have been good copy here on 160-10, but they do not understand propagation and seem to take 6s and 7s during our peak periods. The ZL7 has also been good copy on 80-10, but for the life of me I cannot copy them on 160! The next excitement is KH1 Baker Island starting March 3 and Howland Island starting March 4 or 5. This group put on Kingman Reef for one day, basically a one man 20 meter marathon of 1000 QSOs following the month long Palmyra operation. These are all three working DXpeditions, so no dent has been made in KH5 or KH5K demand, except possibly on 20!

Also of current interest is Libya, 5A21PA operated by Tiny ON4CAT, Frank ON4CEL and Patrick ON4APS. They will be active on all bands on CW, SSB and RTTY with 100 watts. Activity will last until March 7th. For more information, check out their homepage: <http://users.glo.be/~frankyb/5a21pa.html>

The big news is ZONE 23 is coming with a vengeance! First the 11 man Italian team will put JT1Y on from April 7-14 and will be bringing a monoband 40 meter beam amongst other equipment! The web site is <http://www-dx.deis.unibo.it/htdx/jt1y/main.html> which includes operators, frequencies and more. Then in May the Hungarians will try to beat the Italian as a Hungarian group of DXpeditioners, members of the Hungarian Pannon DX Club will operate from Ulan-bator Mongolia from 17 May to 2 June 1998. The team includes HA0HW, HA4GDO, HA6NL, HA7SK and HA7VK. It is planned to keep 2-3 stations simultaneously on the air 24 hours a

day, to maximize band openings. All HF bands will be activated, on SSB, CW, RTTY. Info at <http://www.dunanet.hu/pannondxc/mongoliaeng.htm>

If that's not enough out of Zone 23, UA0YAY and UA0YY have been spotted frequently on 20, and UA0YAY in Tuva QSLs via the buro! Also, JT1BG has been extremely active on 75 at our sunrise and sunset, but so far I haven't been able to get his QSL for my 5BWAZ. (I need Z 18 on 80 and 10 and Z23 on 10 to have them all worked!) This past week I worked JT1CO on 30 at our sunrise, and JT1AA on 40 at our sunrise, both using a butternut vertical!

The 3C0 Expedition has been delayed again due to an armed coup attempt, and the latest from P5 is that Rasa, YU1RL, has gone to Pyongyang, and he is there right now. He will be trying to get a licence from North Korea. I'm not holding my breath!

Finally, watch 10 and 12 following sunrise and sunset. This past week I worked 9M6 on both bands as well as FR5, South Shetlands, and BV JA UA0 on 12. Europe is also sneaking in on both bands along with the middle East on 12. All Indonesian operators are temporarily off the air until after their presidential elections in mid March so as not to spread rumors (?). I'm sure glad Bill doesn't have that power, as he seems to be a major topic of non DX QSOs on the bands these days. Have fun and work some DX.

Remembering the Colvins – de Joe, W5ASP

(Sadly Iris Colvin passed away this month, the reamingin half of the famous Lloyd and Iris Colvin teamed of many YASME DXpeditions. Joe recounts one memory of the then when they were the guests of TDXS here in Houston. I remember meeting them then, back when I was in High School and looking at the list of over 100 counties they had earned DXCC *from*, I am shocked to realize that it was almost 20 years ago! ed.)

The Colvins were guests of TDXS at the Houston convention quite few years ago... someone may actually remember when (K5RC/7 ?).

Lloyd was on a "panel" at the TDXS contest forum along with several other highly regarded hams... anyway at one point Lloyd asked to tell a story on himself... (I also heard it later at Visalia).. seems the local FCC boys in CA had been monitoring his home QTH on some rumor of "excessive power"... they finally showed up at the door and asked to "inspect" the station.... they did so... in great detail, even firing up the amps and comparing meter readings to RF field indicators, etc. Eventually, finidnig nothing amiss they started to leave... while exchanging farewells, Lloyd's vision fell on his framed license handing on the wall next to the door... at that moment he suddenly realized for the first time that his license had expired, and

that he had taken no steps to renew it.... being the gracious host he quickly ushered the FCC guys out the door and snatched the frame off the wall... etc. etc.
