There are no major expeditions scheduled this month, but numerous summer vacation miniexpeditions. The most interesting rumor surrounds 70 Aden. Zoli, HA5PP reports the Deputy Minister of Telecommunications in Sana'a saying that "they really want to start/establish ham radio in Yemen". Zoli has offered his help and support to set up four complete stations (in Sana'a, Taiz and Aden) and train local operators between 1 September and 1 December 1998. He has also applied for three call signs (70BDX & 708CW for the stations located in Sana'a and 701A to be used from Aden). The Deputy Ministre "asked me to collect information on all the hams of he world who want to help and operate from Yemen", Zoly says - those interested are invited to get in touch with Zoli at navus@mail.matav.hu What a great way to start the Fall DX season. TL5A is causing a bit of a stir this month as is 3C5DX. BI4C on July 13-14 and BI5Z on July 16-17 will be new IOTAs and prefixes along with BI3H on July 24-5. Also, listen for 3K8A from Kosovo, soon to be a new former Yugoslav DXCC country??? 1X5AA is Chechnya, a breakaway Russian Republic with quick QSLs from W3HNK.

By the time you read this, Bob Sutton, ZL1RS should be operating from Raoul Island in the Kermadecs (OC-039) as ZL8RS until about July 15. He will operate mostly SSB, with "a little lousy and slow CW on 160 and 30 meters" and some RTTY. His basic intentions, which may change due to work and other factors, are as follows: on 160 meters he will call CQ on 1.828 MHz (rx up 2) 05.05 UTC (ZL8 sunset) and 18.45 UTC (ZL8 sunrise) for 10 minutes when he is able to; on 80-10 meters he will be on or near the usual DX frequencies (on 30 meters he will be calling on 10.120 MHz), around 07.00 UTC-11.00 UTC initially, other times as work allows, particularly at the end of the trip and on any days off that he manages to have. Please note that the generator power supply is supposed to be off from 11.00 UTC to 19.00 UTC, so that any operation between these hours will be battery powered and QRP. QSL via ZL1RS (Robert Sutton, 109 Wright Rd, RD2 Katikati, New Zealand). A good way to get started in IOTA is the 1998 IOTA CONTEST (25-26 JULY). The following amateurs have announced their participation in this year's event

AF-018 - Giuseppe, IT9BLB from Pantelleria Island (IH9). QSL via IT9BLB.
EU-007 - Anthony, EI2HY and Mike, EI2IB as EJ2HY and EJ2IB from Blasket Islands. QSL via home calls.
EU-077 - Batea RDXJ and URE-Rias Baixas operators from Salvora Island as ED1MC and EG1MC. QSL via EA1MC.
EU-116 - Ivan, G3IZD as GD3IZD/P (CW) from the Isle of Man. He will be active between 24 and 27 July and outside the contest he will work CW mainly on WARC. QSL via G3IZD.
EU-120 - The Wirral & District ARC as G4MGR from Hilbre Island. QSL GOVAX.
EU-132 - SP1BNS, SP1DPA, SP1RWK and SP1EOM as SNOSZ from Wolin Island.
NA-056 - Crescencio, CO4BM from La Juventud Island. QSL via CT1ESO.
NA-062 - David, KF8TM/4 (CW) from Cudjoe Key from July 20 to 30
NA-067 - Jon, WB8YJF from Ocracoke Island (USI NC-001S). Jon will be active between 25 July and 1 August, mainly on CW and RTTY with some SSB. QSL via WB8YJF (Jon Severt, 5586 Babbitt Rd., New Albany, OH 43054
NA-100 - GM4FDM and the Windy Yett Contest Group as V26VG from Antigua. The *new* QSL manager for this operation is GM3UTQ either direct or via the buro.

QSL for contacts made outside the contest go to the operator's home call.

NA-111 - Bob, N200 and John, N2LD as N200/p from Long Beach Island (USI NJ001S). QSL via N200 (P.O. Box 345, Tuckerton, NJ 08087-0345, USA).
NA-138 - Vance, N5VL from Amelia Island 10-80 meters CW/SSB. QSL W5IJU or N5VL.

Both RU0C from either AS-69 or an all time new IOTA and RA1QQ & RW1ZZ from EU-160 also are planned. Many other islands just show up, so listen and have some fun. I will be at home that weekend trying to figure out my new FT-1000MP. The RX sure beats the pants off my faithful TS-430 that is being retired to mobile service. See you in the pileups.

Contest Corner by Joe, W5ASP

The July issue of QST appeared recently with the results of the 1997 ARRL Ten Meter contest. Actually what was published appears to be only a first pass at the "final" results, as there were a great number of legitimate scores omitted due to what has been designated as an "unrecognized quirk in the ARRL headquarters computer network".

Fortunately the resulting hue and cry quickly reached the ears of Bill Kennamer, K5FUV the newly designated head of the ARRL Membership Services operation. Bill acknowledged the error and committed to a full revision and republication of the results in the October issue. Kind of a bad scene, but well handled by Bill. This reaffirms the belief held by many of us that we will see some significant improvements at the Contest Desk in the near future.

As published there were two excellent scores posted by TDXSer. Don, N5LZ was ranked 6th W/VE in the SO/Mixed Mode HP and Chuck posted his usual excellent phone only score taking first W/VE. Interestingly TDXS finished a surprising 6th in the ARRL Club category right behind powerhouse YCCC. In fact had the scores of Mike, K5NZ and Bob, N5DU made the listings we would have finished in 5th place. We'll have to see what the next set of "results" say about all this.

Apparently only two of us were active in the CQ WPX CW the last weekend in May. Don, N5LZ obviously did his bit in the "relaxed" mode after a really serious go during the TQP. My effort as VP5Z was anything but relaxed, but the effort appears to have to have paid off with the top SO/20M score.

As I sure some of you know, TDXS teams have finished at or near the top of the semiannual NAQP quite often in the recent past. Unfortunately the acquisition and distribution of awards for these events has been nil. In an effort to get the awards program back on track a drive is under way to find sponsors who will support selected awards in both the winter and summer running of this popular event. At the July TDXS meeting I will recommend that TDXS sign on as a regular sponsor.

The ever popular IARU Championships (the old IARU Radiosport) is due up Saturday after the club meeting. The event runs from 1200Z on Saturday til 1200Z on Sunday, phone, CW or mixed, Single or Multi. Everybody works everybody, and there will be lots of IARU Headquarters stations for additional

multipliers. For us the exchange is 599 (59) plus 07 (our ITU zone). Good way to "beat the heat"... stay inside... keep cool... operate !
