



Its official... The government finally agrees! NOAA now says we are in solar cycle 22. The "smoothed" numbers statistically show the bottom to be March, 1986, however, June, 1986 remains the single lowest month. Remember, you heard it here first!

Ed Tilton, WlHDQ who forecasts for the ARRL doesn't agree. Their "Propagation Forecast Bulletin Nr 2" issued January 12 from WlAW says:

"With solar cycle 21 now well into its llth year, it is of interest to compare this cycle with its immediate predecessors."

I need to give Ed a subscription to the TDXS Bullsheet.

I believe cycle 22 will peak around August or September, 1989 with a maximum of 100 or less. I am sure that there will be a month or two which will have a mean solar flux of over 100, but, when taken on the average, I think this cycle will peak with a "smoothed" flux of less than 100. You may remember that the last cycle peaked in December, 1979 with a "smoothed" number of 164.5.

All this is bad news for the VHF and 10 meter fans, but its definitely better than today. To answer the question specifically, it looks to me like the 87-88 contest season will be a repeat of 84-85 season, maybe even a little better.

- 2. If you operate at a Multi-op during a contest, the total score shall be divided equally amongst the crew.
 - 3. Endorsements for 2, 5 and 10 million points as we go.
- 4. Complaints, suggestions and ideas shall be listened to if I want to and adopted if I like them.

The first contest of 1987 with a club competition will be the CQ WW 160 meter CW test, followed by the Sprints and the DX contests. Don't forget to mark your summary sheet with "TDXS"!

For those of you that worry about money and budgets and things like that, you will be happy (or unhappy) to know that you have already allocated some funds for this project but I never used them. In other words, this won't cost much so quit worrying about it.

Thanks to the Lotus Development people we have the means to tabulate and display this data in an interesting and informative manner. Every few months I will publish the point totals in the B.S. Sound exciting? I knew you would think so.

Also available this month are the results of the first IARU HF WORLD CHAMPION—SHIP (was called RADIOSPORT). The group at NR5M (+K2TNO, KE5IV, KC5U, N5DU, NN5M, NT5D) went all out to turn in an impressive score of 752,400 points. However, this was not enough to outlast the group at KM3T who edged ahead by 50,000 points. Anyway, second place is not bad. Other members of the club were on the air for this event as well. 
