From the TDXS Archives

Ten years ago this month, TDXS President Bob Walworth N5ET reported on the upcoming Visalia DX Convention and the announced program on H40AA and its pending DXCC status. The 1998 TDXS Field Day plans were firming up. Contest Chairman Joe Staples W5ASP reported that Dave McCarty K5GN operated from Turks & Caicos in the WPX CW contest and placed 3rd in the world with a very modest setup! Quite an accomplishment to say the least. W5ASP operated WPX CW from ZF2NE and finished with First Place Single World Op on 20m and set a new world record in the process! TDXS finished 18th in World Club competition with only 8 entries! K5NA operating as NN5AA won the USA 10m Single Band category. Dale Martin KG5U took 5th in QRP for the CW Sweepstakes contest. TDXS finished in 5th place in the January NAQP contest with 5 of our members reaching the top 10 scores (Eric, NM5M #2; Trey, N5KO #3; Steve, KN5H #7; Dennis, K7BV #9 and Dave, K5GN #10). DX Chairman Buzz Jehle N5UR reported on the upcoming DXpedition to St. Brandon 3B7, and TDXS's own George Wagner K5KG was among the operators. Buzz also announced his plans to put on a new IOTA in Nicaragua as H75A operating from Isla de Venado from May 22-24, 1998 along with ops AD5A, N5FTR, and AB5EB.

Twenty years ago last month, Dave Busick N5JJ became a silent key. It doesn't seem possible that it's been that long. Ironically, Dave left this world while the 1988 ARRL International CW DX Contest was in progress. We still miss you buddy!

Tom Taormina K5RC is still busy upgrading the Virginia City Super-Station. He has 15 more yagis to assemble and put up and is putting an antenna team together. If anyone wants to spend a week working and playing radio get in touch with Tom.

Dave McCarty K5GN is working in Qatar A7. Dennis Alexander W5KU reports that he's been teaching the locals how to put up full size verticals on the beach for 160M and 80M.

Dennis Motschenbacher K7BV says he will be active this summer from the Caribbean but on 6 meters ONLY. Look for him to sign as V36M (not V3/K7BV as first reported) from Caye Caulker Island (NA-073, WW Loc. EK57XR), Belize, from June 20-26th, and as 5J0M (not HK0/K7BV as first reported or as 5J0E as initially hoped) from San Andres Island (NA-033, WLOTA LH-2990, WW Loc EK92DM) between June 28th and July 6th. His equipment will be a FT-450 with ACOM-1000 amplifier, running 1KW into a 7 element and 3 element beam. The main frequency will be 50.106.2 MHz USB and /B. The pilot station will be Pat, W5OZI. Hummm, wonder who that could be?

Speaking of 5J0E, if you worked the last TDXS DXpedition to San Andres Island, Paul W5PF will be bringing 5J0E cards to the meeting for the deserving. Paul also says, if you spot Marion Island ZS8 be sure to let him know. That's one of the last entities Paul still needs. They should be QRV by May 9th.

You've probably heard by now that Force-12 is moving to Bridgeport, Texas northwest of the Dallas-Fort Worth area. The company was recently purchased by Texas amateur Mark Hooper, N5WEB. The entire Force 12 product line will be manufactured there.

Several years ago when I started updating our webpages and member database, we were missing the names of a couple early members. Richard King K5NA helped fill these in for me. Unfortunately I was unable to determine the whereabouts of Edward Jones WA5YEL (TDXS member #11) who joined in 1972. Callsign historical data didn't indicate a new callsign either. Charlie Neiman KG5RQ from Houston Amateur Supply was also looking for him and recently contacted me. Charlie said that Ed was one of his mentors and wanted to know what ever became of him. He clearly remembers the 1972 TDXS Field Day in Willis, Texas that Ed had invited him to. Charlie said,

"I was 15 at the time and Ed was 27. He was like a big brother to me.

Back in 1972 I lived in Fondren Park. There were tons of hams in that neighborhood back then. He had Collins 32-S series twins and I watched him build a SB-220 amp one winter. He had an aluminum tower with a Mosley tri-bander on it. Every thing was first class and super tidy. He seemed passionate about the hobby and it strikes me a little strange that he might of just dropped out. But strange things do happen. That is also the year that I met Allen Brier (N5XZ, ex-WB5BIR) and David Busick (N5JJ - SK). We went to Junior High together and were novices. Though David was a year younger than I, he taught me some tricks of the trade on CW that I still use today. Man could I tell you some stories about spending afternoons after school at Davids' house. I operated Max Busick's (W5GJ - SK) station many times. The Busick antennas were something to behold and operate on. The field days there.... and Mary Busick making sandwiches for David and me on a Sunday afternoon.... so many fond memories."

Charlie and I were hot on Ed's trail again, and after a few days Ed was found in New Jersey now signing KC2HP. Ed is now retired from Allstate Insurance Company. He left Houston in 1973 for Atlanta where he and his wife Jackie raised two children, and then moved to New Jersey where he's been ever since. His 4th district callsign was WA4ABG. Ed says that with all the travelling and raising a family ham radio took a back seat. With retirement time on his hands, he plans to get reacquainted with the hobby again. "Not very active at the moment, but if I can get my antenna system repaired, will get back on the air", says Ed. We finally have control over our domain names again. The transfer of TDXS domain names from GoDaddy to TigerTech was completed on April 27th. TDXS Repeater Chairman and DX cluster guru Glenn Anderson WB5TUF has moved our internet DX cluster to its new home in The Woodlands. The new IP address is 75.148.198.113, or via URL address dxc.tdxs.net. As for IRLP on the 442 machine, "Igor" and 2 meter access to the DX cluster, Glenn says, "It's going to be a while...I plan to rebuild the digit that was on One Houston Center and use it as a netrom node to repeat the packet from The Woodlands. I have to get permission to install antennas on the roof of our new building. If that doesn't work, I will try to get a VPN connection to a site that is more centrally located." 
